

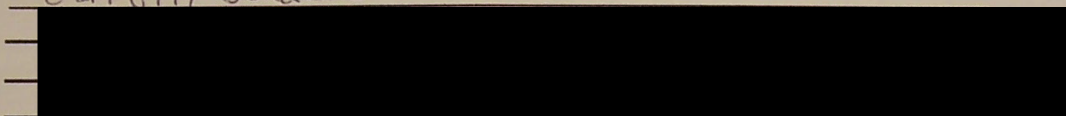

EARLY SETTLERS.

General William Campbell
I will speak of one other family and then I may be done.

There has never lived in Lincoln county a more honorable, high-minded Christian gentleman than Campbell Edmiston, Sr., who married Miss Stewart, in Virginia, and settled on the old Clark homestead, near Howell, perhaps in the teens, and raised a large family. There his first wife died, and he married a second wife. I do not know her name. She died and he moved to where Mrs. Margaret Edmiston now lives, which was then a public place and had a postoffice called Cane Creek.

His second wife died and he married Mrs. Dobbins. His death occurred some years ago. He had four sons and six daughters.

John, the first son, married Miss Margaret Harvel. His descendants are John, William, Robert, Sidney, and three daughters, Mary, Clara, and Kate. They are all well known and popular.

William, the second son, married Miss Hall. Of this family I know nothing.

Campbell, Jr., the third son, married Miss Buchanan. His descendants are Toker and Mrs. J. P. Dwiggin.

Thomas, the fourth son, died when young.

Eliza, the first daughter, married Wm. M. Old. There was one daughter as a result of this union—Mrs. W. B. Fonville, who now lives in Nashville. Mr. Wm. Loving's children are their grandchildren, also Miss Nellie Old.

Rosannah, the second daughter, married Joseph Smith, and had one son, Willie.

Catherine, the third daughter, married John Beatty, had one daughter, Miss Jennie. Mr. Beatty died and she married Stephen Hart, by whom she had two sons and one daughter, Miss Maggie.

Martha, the fourth daughter, married Rev. Watson; had one daughter, Mrs. Walker Greer, who now resides in Birmingham, Ala.

Mary, the fifth daughter, married Maj. J. H. Greer; had one son, Marion.

Josie, the sixth daughter, married Sam Slaughter, and had one daughter, of whom I know nothing.

I might have said Wm. Loving's first wife was a daughter of Mrs. Eliza Old. She also had a son named Clay, who died in the army. And John Old married Miss Belle Hart, and left one daughter, Miss Nellie.

No family of children and grandchildren have lived to reflect more honor upon their worthy ancestry than has the Edmiston family. I may not have given their names in the regular order of their births.
